Common Questions and Answers for Services

Is blood work required before a procedure, and if so, what time frame is it good for?

-We require blood work for all procedures for general anesthesia. We typically request owners have their rDVM perform the labs and the results sent to us beforehand. We include in-house labs on all of our estimates for a final pre-anesthetic check at the doctor's discretion. However, they do not replace labwork to be done ahead of time. We ask for labwork to be completed at a minimum of 3 weeks prior to a scheduled surgery date. A good time frame to have them done is one to two months prior.

What type of blood work needs to be done?

- For young, healthy pets we require a full CBC/Chemistry Panel
- For older pets over the age of 8 we require a full CBC/Chemistry Panel, and for cats we ask for a T4 in addition
- Pets with a history of heart disease we require a full CBC/Chemistry Panel and strongly recommend a ProBNP. Potentially additional diagnostics may be requested per the doctor's review.
- Along with the regular requirement, if a pet is on a grain-free diet we strongly recommend a ProBNP

How will the anesthesia be handled with other medical issues?

-We tailor our anesthesia routine to cater to each patient's individual needs. Depending on if the patient has comorbidities we may request specific diagnostics to prepare for anesthesia (specific blood testing, imaging, cardiac work up, etc).

Is the imaging done at a separate time than the cleaning?

-The imaging is done at the same time before the procedure. If there's any extractions being done the will take more images afterwards to make sure there's no tooth remnants left behind

Will my pet have to stay overnight?

-No we do not keep patients overnight. If something needed to be monitored for a patient overnight we would refer the patient to a 24 hour emergency hospital of the owners choosing like TVRH, VSH or NCSU.
